Stay tuned as the summer seals blast off into their next unit! You guessed it...SPACE!



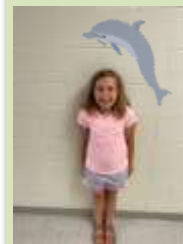

### Student Corner

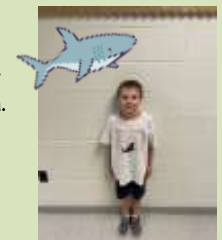
If you could be an animal that lives in the water, what animal would you choose? Why?
